The Les Menuires 7 (part II)

As I went to press last week it appears the dispute over in Les Menuires came to an end resulting in the staff receiving their wages and expenses and the owner of the company having his knuckles wrapped by the French authorities with a threat to employ future staff under a French contract, paying French taxes and more importantly paying staff the french minimum wage of at least 9 euros /ph.

Now anyone who has gone for a job with a ski company would have noticed the small wage paid (around £50-£100) per week. But they would have been reassured that the inclusive costs of lift pass/ski hire/food/accomodation etc being taking into account would take their equivalent pay out of the chinese sweatshop category.

So how would these two compare?

It can be done in one of two ways. Most French contracts are limited to 35 hours a week, which is completely impractical for the majority of ski jobs. Using that figure as a base comes to about 315€ per week.

Of course we could work out how many real hours a chalet girl really work? Lets say 7am-10am and 4pm-10pm, 6 days a week = 54 hours week @ 9€ p/h = 486€.

Now the deductions.

A Courchevel valley season workers lift pass is about 450€. Calculating ski hire for the season is tricky not only because not every member of staff may need to hire boots/skis but because the ski shops which are used by the ski company for client rental have a vested interest to rent equipment to the staff. Many staff also purchase new ski/boots throughout the season.

The same can be said for accomodation. Most companies include accomodation and its cost is automatically removed from the payslip. If companies are forced to pay you more they could also charge you more for the accomodation

Finally take off some French taxes.

So in the end the English workers get paid a bit more, the French authorities are happy, some other cost savings are made elsewhere in ski companies, any slight increases in cost are passed on to the holiday makers.

But as this will (probably) never happen there's nothing to worry about. or is there?
